## CHEERLEADING CONSTITUTION

### PURPOSE

- To support Davis High School and promote school spirit at all school activities
- Set an example to the students and athletes at Davis High School
- To display great sportsmanship and great relationships with teammates, students, faculty, staff, other schools and their students. Develop good character and cooperation skills as well as commitment, self-discipline and integrity
- To learn and display leadership and friendship to everyone around you by being positive and friendly, inclusive, and maintaining high academic standards
- To compete in cheerleading competitions, aiming to be the best team you can be
- Utilizing social media in a positive and appropriate manner

### REQUIREMENTS

- Maintain a 3.0 GPA or higher per term, and no F's any term, once on the team
- Once on the team, "U"s must be made up in 1 week
- Must be a full-time student at Davis High School (to be full-time must be in at least 5 classes all year-seminary does not count as part of this requirement.)
  - Attending DHS or plan to attend DHS (variance must be cleared)
- Must attend school regularly
- Expected to make a commitment to Davis Cheer for the full school year
- Must be able to meet the physical demands that will be placed upon them
- Set a positive example to students and teammates & have respect for administration, faculty and coaches
- Must be able to attend all mandatory practices and performances
- Once selected, every cheerleader must download the BAND app
- There will be a team website where cheers, choreography and other information will be posted for the team. It is recommended that a cheerleader/parent has access
- Must be able to finance the expense of being a Davis Cheerleader

### ELIGIBILITY

- [Tryout Information - Page 22](#)
- 3.0 cumulative GPA for 3<sup>rd</sup> Term
- No F's
- All U's must be worked off prior to tryouts
- Former cheerleaders are required to tryout
- Must be able to meet the physical demands that will be placed upon them
- Competition teams *are* allowed, as long as Davis Cheer requirements come first
  - Must attend all Davis practices, games, performances, competitions, activities
  - Davis Cheer performances come before any dance/cheer/recitals/competitions

## CLASS REQUIREMENTS

Cheerleaders will enroll in the cheerleading class – 5<sup>th</sup> Period (first class on 'B' day). Cheerleaders will participate on a point system basis, where it will be graded like a normal class, where attendance, preparedness and attitude will be evaluated. The cheer coach will keep track and reserve the right to give/take away points where/when appropriate.

- Academic Grade will be based on 100 points given at the start of each term
  - ❖ A = 100-88
  - ❖ B = 87-78
  - ❖ C = 77-65
  - ❖ D = 64 – 55
  - ❖ F = 54 – 0
- Loss of Points/Privileges and Penalties

  - If cheerleader receives below an A and/or U at midterm or end of the term, parents will be notified
  - Consequences cannot be made up (these start over each term)
  - There are several options to make up points. Point make ups must be done 1 week prior to the end of the term.

## EXPENSES

The cost for cheerleading is **\$1995** per member/per year according to the District Fee Schedule. This may be paid in installments. [Davis Cheer Payment Schedule-Page 23](#)

### Costs

- **\$995: Uniforms, Camps, Choreography, School Outfits, etc.**
- **\$5.00: Drug Testing Fee**
- **\$1000: Extended Travel Trip (excluding food)**
- If you owe money after the payment deadlines you will not receive uniforms until payment is made (unless prior arrangements have been made)
- Additional apparel and items will be earned through fundraising
- Refunds will **NOT** be given if a member decides to quit or is dismissed from the team

## FUNDRAISING

- All fundraisers go into the general cheerleading fund, a team goal will be set per fundraiser.
  - Approved fundraisers: Golf Tournament, Halloween Dance, Mini Cheer
- Cheerleaders may individually fundraise, but it must be done individually

## COMPETITION

- This will be a competition team, and we plan to compete in 5-6 competitions throughout the school year.
- A select number of team members will be selected for the competition team at the end of August based upon summer practice, performance and skill.
- You must agree to attend all mandatory competition practices and competitions
- National competition will be an *option* at the discretion of the administration.
  - The PTA will hold a parent vote. At least 80% approval is required for the team to participate in a national competition. (District Policy)
    - May be required to compete on a Sunday

## **ATTENDANCE**

### **SUMMER**

Summer practices are vital to the success of our cheer team. You are allowed to miss a total of 5 June practices, with the exception of the mandatory dates.

June:

- Practices:
  - **Monday-Friday 6:00-8:30 AM**
  - **Tuesday evenings 6:00-8:30 PM**
- **Mandatory Golf Tournament: June 10<sup>th</sup>**
- **Cheer Camp: June 24<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> (All Day)**
- Tumbling: TBA Optional

July:

- No practice
- You are expected to attend the Kaysville City Parade unless prior arrangements have been made.
- No Tumbling

August:

- All of August is mandatory
- 2 A Days: 5<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> Time TBD
- Tuesday/Thursday evenings TBD
- Tumbling: TBA Optional

### **GAMES**

- Cheerleaders are required to cheer at all football games, girls' & boys' basketball games, and any State games.
  - State games include Football, Volleyball, Boys Basketball and Girls Basketball
- For all other sports or events, the team will be divided up and will attend their assigned game, supporting Davis High.
  - Wrestling, Track, Soccer, Baseball, Softball, Golf and any other event that is deemed appropriate for cheerleaders to attend.

### **PRACTICE**

- Cheerleaders are expected to attend every practice and class period
- No practice will be held on 3-day weekends (September-November)
- Practice WILL be held on 3-day weekends (December-February)
- Saturday morning practices will start in September
  - At least ONE Saturday a month (September-February)

## ABSENCES

- Excused absences include: weddings, religious ceremonies and funerals of immediate family members and school related activities that are cleared by the coach, ahead of time.
- An excused absence for a serious injury or illness must come from a doctor's note or a text/note from the parent of when the doctor's appointment is.
  - A doctor's note is required for anything that would prevent cheerleader from being at practice/performance or an event with the team
  - A doctor's note will also need to be presented once the cheerleader is cleared. The cheerleader will not be allowed to participate until note is presented.
- All excused absences from a game/class/practice must be sent to the head coach in writing **24 hours before the beginning of that game/class/practice.**
- Missing week of a performance/game/practice will remove you from routine/game
- Injury and illness does not excuse you. You are still required to dress, attend practice and games. If injured/ill you won't need to participate, but will need to be in attendance
- If you miss class/practice excused or unexcused your spot in a routine may be moved, removed or you may be replaced.
- You will be allotted one excused absence from class per semester (excluding mandatory competition practices) December-February
- Pre-arranged vacation requires requests to be submitted at least six weeks prior to the date being requested off through the Cheer website.
  - Request will be approved or denied by the coach
- Vacations will not be excused in the months of December-February

## APPEARANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Adhere to the clothing schedule for practice, games and school days. Points will be taken off by the outlined class requirements.
- No jewelry, acrylic nails, or gum at practice or games (state policy).
- If a cheerleader chooses to pierce her ears or other body parts during the cheer season, she must have her jewelry removed for all practices, games and competitions.
- Uniform must be clean when worn, wear white no show socks with your uniform. (points will be deducted if they are not white), hair must be pulled back from face.

## TRANSPORTATION

- Getting to and from practice, evening practices, and home games/activities, stunt clinic and local camps are parent's responsibility to provide transportation for their cheerleader.
- Cheerleaders are required to ride to and from games, competitions and all other performances and events assigned by a parent carpool
  - District Car Pool Policy will be provided
  - In circumstances prevent you from riding in the carpool, written notice from a parent must be provided and a parent/guardian is responsible to get you to/from the event
  - Buses will be provided for state games only

## **CAPTAIN / CO-CAPTAINS**

- The coaches have the final say on the captains that are selected which will be uncontested by students, parents and/or administrators.
- The Captain position is open to Seniors and Co-Captains are open to Juniors and Seniors.
- Campaigning for a captain position will not be tolerated and you will be removed from the ballot.
- Captains must behave in compliance with the constitution at all times and demonstrate the highest standards.

## **HEALTH, SAFETY AND LIABILITY**

- a. It must be understood that cheerleading carries with it a risk of physical injury. Strict adherence to the rules and guidelines is necessary to ensure the safety of all team members, including stunting, tumbling, and cheering. Even with the highest degree of caution, it cannot be guaranteed that injuries will not occur.
- b. The cheerleader or parent/guardian will not hold the Coach, Davis High School, or Davis School District responsible in the event of an accident or injury.
- c. If a cheerleader becomes injured and is unable to participate in cheer activities, a medical release, signed by a physician, must be submitted before the cheerleader can resume any cheer activity.
- d. All team members must have medical clearance from a physician before engaging in school cheerleading activities.

## **PROBATION**

Probation is the loss of performance, game, and halftime privileges. You are still required to attend all games, performances or practices but will not be allowed to wear your uniform. You will sit in the stands with the coach/advisor.

- Probation may occur for the following reasons (but is not limited to):
  - Grades below a 3.0 for the prior term (and will be reevaluated at mid-terms)
  - Any U's. The cheerleader will be on probation until U is worked and paid off
  - Any F's (will be reevaluated at mid-terms)
  - Rude, disrespectful, demeaning behavior
  - Truancy from class
  - Participating in illegal activities/behaviors
  - Not following personal conduct rules (see below)
  - Causing unnecessary drama or contention on the team
  - Any violation of this constitution
  - Coaches and administration reserve the right to dismiss cheerleaders at their discretion, at any time

## **PERSONAL CONDUCT (includes all forms of Social Media)**

Everything you do and say reflects Davis High School and our cheer team. The actions, words, posts, and texts you do, speak, type and send should never be rude, disrespectful, offensive, demeaning, and/or negative. Cheerleading is a privilege not a right, you are to be a high moral character and an example to your fellow students and community members.

- Do not complain, gossip or talk badly about another cheerleader to a teammate, another team or on social media.
- Do not smoke, vape, drink, or use illegal drugs. Doing so will result in removal from the team.
- Do not cheat, lie, steal, become truant, participate or support illegal activity.
- No bullying or hazing team members or other students in any way.
- Respectful behavior is expected in halls, classrooms, actives and games as well as social media, and outside of any school function
- Cheerleaders are to conduct themselves in an appropriate manner on social media sites, as well as texts. Any use of vulgar pictures, or language, or sexting will be grounds for removal from the team depending on the severity as determined by the coach and the Administration. Cheerleaders are responsible for their personal websites and postings as well as postings on other students' websites. The area of appropriateness will include, but are not limited to, language (abbreviated or alluding to), pictures, suggestive poses, clothing, reference to alcohol, drugs, and tobacco. Any question of appropriateness will be decided by the administration.
- Cheerleaders are expected to behave in a manner that is becoming to the individual, as well as to the organization they represent. They should be aware that in or out of uniform they are representatives of the cheerleading squad and the high school they attend and represent and should act accordingly

### CONSEQUENCES *\*You can't make up consequences!*

- **1st Offense** = loss of cheering in 1<sup>st</sup> ½ of the next game (includes state playoff games)
- **2nd Offense** = loss of cheering in 1<sup>st</sup> ½ of the next game AND loss of performing at next halftime (includes state playoff games)
- **3rd Offense** = loss of cheering at the next game, loss of performing at halftime, will need to help with set up and take down of next HOME game with custodians
  - (once football/basketball season is over, loss of performing in the next assembly)

### MAKE UP POINTS

- +5 points = Team Motivational
- +5 points = Vacuum (1) floor mat
- +10 points = attending a Fall/Spring sport that you aren't assigned to (not covering for someone else)
- +10 points = take a team treat to another sport/team
- +20 points = cheering at a basketball game that you aren't assigned to (not covering for someone else)
- Other makeup options available throughout the year
  - All Make Up Points must be done 1 WEEK prior to the end of the term.
